#### How to get to Oxford

**Rail:** frequent train services from London Paddington and regular links to other parts of the country via Didcot, Reading and Birmingham.

**Coach:** frequent services from London Victoria, Gatwick and Heathrow; connections with other parts of the country.

**Car:** M40 links with M1, M4, M5, M25. Leave M40 at junction 8 from the East or junction 9 from the North.

**Parking:** prohibited within the Science Area; in some cases a parking permit can be arranged. There is a limited amount of public pay and display parking in Keble Road and Norham Gardens.

**Park and Ride:** there are five sites on the outskirts of the city and a quick and frequent bus service to the city centre.
